Catholic Life - Eastertide

In the liturgical year while Lent lasts for forty days, Eastertide lasts for fifty. During Eastertide the new life that Jesus won for us, and what it now makes possible, are presented for our contemplation. We hear the accounts of the resurrection appearances but we also hear of the transformative effect these encounters had on the disciples. As we go through Eastertide the Sunday liturgy makes clear to us what the resurrection means. As we celebrate the feasts of the saints during this period we are also made aware that their strength and power comes from the resurrection. They were faithful to the risen Lord and filled with his life. Let us pray that as we journey through Eastertide we may become more aware of what the resurrection means for us in our lives today.



After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples for the third time. The disciples had been out fishing and as soon as they came ashore they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?"He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He replied, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you." Jesus said to him, "Look after my sheep." Then he said to him a third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter said, "Lord, you know everything; you know I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep.

In the Gospel we read how Jesus called on Peter to be a witness, to look after the people and continue to spread the good news. We are each called to continue this very special mission of love towards our neighbour.

"God is full of love: to him be praise forever!"



April Spotlight: Article of the week

In school we teach the children that rights are unconditional and inalienable, they cannot be taken away. However what does each right mean. Over the coming weeks we will be exploring what each of the rights mean including input from our own RRSA group.

During April, we reflect on Earth Day when we consider stewardship of our common home. We are each called to be stwards of God's creation and to do what we can to protect our world. We can all recycle plastic, paper, glass and metals - a simple way to recycle cans is now through the school. But there are other small changes we can each make - turing of the lights, TV and electrical devices when they are not being used. We can recycle our clothes through charity books or bring uniform into school where it can be used as part of our pre-loved uniform stock. Or maybe look at what we can do in our local area - walking to school rather than driving or taking part in a litter pick. There are so many activities we can take part in to protect our physical world.

Aston Church Road closure, Washwood Heath, Birmingham- HS2 works

Aston Church Road Closure which will start from Saturday 5 October 2024 lasting approximately 14 months. This closure is to accommodate the arrival of HS2 in the area. These works include the demolition and reconstruction of Aston Church Road overbridge to carry the high speed train across the dual carriageway.

Aston Church Road will be closed in both directions to motorised traffic and a fully signed diversion will be in place. Access for pedestrians and cyclists will remain in place for the duration of the works. Bus services will not be diverted but may experience some delays. Car Parking

Thank you to the parents who are using the mosque car park and walking the short distance to school. However we have parents who continue to park illegally, park on the pavement and allow children to get out at the crossing. Can I please ask that you consider all our families when you park, it is extremely difficult and dangerous for families to walk safely on the pavement at times. We have been in contact with the community police and have requested that traffic enforcers patrol the area at the start and end of the day. The safety of all members of our school community is our first priority.



As a school we believe in the importance of attendance and work closely with Birmingham LA and parents to ensure that all children are in school every day. Research has shown that absence disrupts the education of the individual pupil and the whole class. Children who do not attend regularly:

- do not achieve well in exams
- find it difficult to maintain friendships
- are more likely to become involved in crime
- miss out on opportunities in further education and the world of work?

Our attendance declined during March so I would ask that over the coming weeks we make a real effort to get to school every day.

We have recently had a number of families contact us about leave in term time. As you already know a 2013 amendment to The Education (Pupil Registration) Regulations 2006, means that Head Teachers may no longer authorise leave during term time except where the circumstances are exceptional. This is in accordance with Birmingham Local Authority's 'Leave in Term Time Guidance.' If families choose to take leave in term time they may be subject to legal procedures.

A letter has been sent out explaining attendance procedures and I would ask that you read it carefully and consider the implications if you chose to take children out of school during term time. We are aware that families have been fined by Birmingham LA and this can be a significant amount of money and we do not want to see our families in this situation. Birmingham has informed us that they have issued a fine of over £1400 to a family for taking children out of school for a holiday.

E –Safety Top Tips from Mr Yasir

Each week Mr Yasir will be sharing top tips for staying safe online. This week we are looking at mobile phones; when is the right time to get them and how can we ensure they are used safely.



During the last few weeks, we have been made aware of pupils acting inappropriately while online. There have been examples of pupils setting up fake accounts to request information about members of staff with degratory language used. Behaviour such as this will not be tolerated and if required legal advice and support sought.

We have also had reports of inappropriate language being used across social media which has caused upset and distress. I urge parents to talk to their children about behaviour online as all incidents have taken place at home. Please ensure you are vigilant about what your child is doing and saying while online and if you need advice or support about putting parental controls on devices plesae contact the school and arrange an appointment with Mr Yasir, who will be more than happy to support you.



We do not usually inform your parents, teachers or anyone else if you contact the school nurse. We might inform someone if we were concerned about your safety, but we would usually speak to you first. Your messages are stored and can be seen by other healthcare staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting STOP to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.
