RRSA Article of the Month - Article 12 - respect for the views of the child



This month we are considering article 12 where we consider the views of each child and more importantly respect their views. Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life. Over the last few weeks the children have been considering how they can share their views with many children putting themselves forward for leadership roles within the school. It has been wonderful to see those who have nominated themselves to be considered school councillors with the class democratically electing the child they feel can best represent their views. Over the next 2 weeks we will also be looking at our faith Council and Liturgical Leaders.

Article 12 is incredibly important because:

- •Being involved in decisions makes you feel like a part of it, you have ownership.
- Relationships between children and adults improve when there's communication.
- •School is there to help children to learn, so it is important to put children at the centre.
- •Children have some great ideas that adults might never think of.
- •It helps to prepare you for adulthood.
- •Children and young people feel valued.
- •Involving young people means there are more people to make a difference.
- •We all have different views and experiences, so including everyone means we get lots of perspectives.
- •It can help you to learn about politics and democracy.
- •It is your right to be involved in decisions which affect you!

At home we can also take time to talk to children about their feelings and viewpoints. This is especially important for our Year 6 children who are making important decisions about secondary school now.

Live Simply




As a school we are committed to living simply by answering the call for us to care for our common home and stand in solidarity with our sisters and brothers around the world.

We are learning how to be kind, take turns and be good friends to everyone. It has been a fantastic start to Reception and we can't wait for all the adventures still to come!!




Year 2 - Wonderful Writers


Year 4 - A Start Full of Learning and Creativity

They considered how her example of kindness and love towards others helped them and how we are each called to follow this example.


In Art the children have started to explore tone when drawing to create the illusion of 3D in their sketches.






Year 5 - Change through Prayer

Attendance



As a school we believe in the importance of attendance and work closely with Birmingham LA and parents to ensure that all children are in school every day. Research has shown that absence disrupts the education of the individual pupil and the whole class. Children who do not attend regularly:

- do not achieve well in exams
- find it difficult to maintain friendships
- are more likely to become involved in crime
- miss out on opportunities in further education and the world of work?

We have recently had a number of families contact us about leave in term time. As you already know a 2013 amendment to The Education (Pupil Registration) Regulations 2006, means that Head Teachers may no longer authorise leave during term time except where the circumstances are exceptional. This is in accordance with Birmingham Local Authority's 'Leave in Term Time Guidance.' If families choose to take leave in term time they may be subject to legal procedures.

A letter has been sent out explaining attendance procedures and I would ask that you read it carefully and consider the implications if you chose to take children out of school during term time. We are aware that families have been fined by Birmingham LA and this can be a significant amount of money and we do not want to see our families in this situation.

Internet Safety – Advice for Parents

During the summer the children may have spent more time online—playing games, watching videos, or chatting with friends. Now that they are back to school, it is a good time to review their online time so that they remain safe and happy while using the internet but also get the balance right between online time and homework time.

Here are some top tips for parents:

Set clear boundaries

Agree on screen time limits and make sure devices are used in shared family spaces where possible.

• Keep communication open

Talk regularly with your child about what they're doing online. Encourage them to speak up if something makes them feel uncomfortable.

Use parental controls

Set age-appropriate filters on apps, games, and websites. Most devices and internet providers offer easy-to-use safety settings.

Times Tables Rockstars



We have launched Times Table Rockstars again which is a great app to use with the children as they learn their times tables in a fun and interactive way.

Your child will have brought home their log in details but if you are unsure please see your child's teacher about how to use this app to improve times table knowledge.

Every week we will celebrate the children who are successful – it may be that they are in the top 10 scorers, it may be most improved, it may be for certificates achieved.

The police have issued a number of tickets to drivers and will continue to monitor parking and driving on Bridge Road. 
